

KALGOORLIE.

Kalgoorlie, March 28.

At the Sessions to-day the charge against Guilo Davini of indecently assaulting Emily Freman, aged five years, was proceeded with. Mrs. Wilson, witness for the defence, who was yesterday called to prove an alibi, was re-called by the prosecution for cross-examination, during which she admitted her memory was bad. She could not recollect what occurred from one day to another. She also admitted that some of her evidence given on the previous day was incorrect. After two hours' deliberation the jury failed to agree, and Davini was committed for further trial at the next Sessions. A. B. Crowley was found guilty yesterday of the embezzlement of two sums of money belonging to the Boulder Mechanics' Institute, and was discharged under the First Offenders Act. In the case of Shimado, a Japanese, charged with unlawfully wounding a fellow-countryman, a plea of insanity was raised. Shimado was medically examined by two doctors, who gave a certificate that he was quite sane. He then pleaded guilty, and was remanded for sentence.
