KALGOORLIE.

Kalgoorlie, March 27.

At the sessions to-day A. B. Crowley, late secretary of the Boulder Mechanics' Institute, was found guilty on two charges of the embezzlement of £10 and £1 respectively. He was recommended to mercy, and was remanded for sentence. Wm. O'Donnell, John Francis Noonan, and Robert St. Clair were charged with robbery with violence. O'Donnell was acquitted. St. Clair and Noonan were found guilty, and were sentenced to five years' penal servitude. Guilo Davini was arraigned on a charge of indecently assaulting a child named Emily Freeman, aged five years, on March 15. It was alleged that the accused enticed the child into Commonwealth Park, where two women swore they saw him behaving indecently. The defence was an alibi. Mrs. Wilson, wife of another Italian, swore that the accused was on her premises, at Boulder, at the time the alleged offence took place. Witness was severely cross-examined by Mr. Finnerty, and her evidence somewhat shaken. The Court then adjourned till the following morning.
